This consecration will be realized by observing the Rule of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis and living in chastity, poverty, and obedience according to the Constitutions of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George.

Rite of Initiation into the Religious Life

The Provincial Superior and Postulants approach and stand in front of the sanctuary.

Mother M. Mediatrix questions the Postulants:

Dear Postulants, what is your petition?

The Postulants respond:

We wish to try your way of life, / and are willing to be tested / that we may follow Christ wholeheartedly / in this Community of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George. / As a sign that we belong to your Community, / we ask to be given your religious habit.

Mother M. Mediatrix prays:

Let us pray: Lord God, You give us the desire to hear Your call. Listen favorably to the prayer of Your servants, who desire to serve You more perfectly, and who ask to join our Community, the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George. Grant that our life in common may become a communion of love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Religious Community answers: Amen.

The Postulants turn to the Community.

Religious Community answers the Postulants:

Dear Postulants, / with great joy we receive you into our Community. / We pray that you will become one with us according to Christ's prayer: / "That they may all be one as You, Father, are in Me and I am in You".

Dear Postulants, / we will pray and work with you, / and we will always be there when you need us, / because God wants us to serve Him in Community.

"We will render each other mutual service / according to the different gifts bestowed on us. / Thus our solidarity will constantly increase / until that day on which it is brought to perfection. / Then, / saved by grace, / we will offer flawless glory to God as a family, / beloved by God and by Christ our Spouse and Brother."

(Constitution on the Church in the Modern World)

The Postulants turn to Bishop Paprocki.

Bishop Paprocki addresses the Postulants:

Dear Postulants: You are called to follow Christ in the religious life, not because of your good works, but because of the grace of God. Receive the habit as a sign of your dedication to God and wear it with humble hearts. God loves you, and you should be clothed in sincere compassion, in kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Bear with each other. Forgive one another. The Lord has forgiven you. Now you must do the same. Over these clothes, to keep them together and to complete them, put on love.

(See Col. 3:12-14)

Bishop Paprocki hands each Postulant the religious habit of the Congregation individually.

Bishop Paprocki says to each Postulant:

The religious habit be the garment of your salvation.

Each Postulant answers: Amen.

The Postulants leave to change into their habits while the Sisters' choir and people sing.

Bishop Paprocki says:

Dear Sisters, the founder of your order, St. Francis, answered Christ's call in a life according to the Gospel. Like St. Francis, you want to accept the Good News and to live it in a reply of love. To guide you in this way, receive the *Rule and Life* of the Brothers and Sisters of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis and the *Constitutions* of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George.

Bishop Paprocki hands each Postulant the Constitutions.

Bishop Paprocki says:

Receive the *Breviary* of this Congregation and pray it in the name of the Church and in the intentions of the Church.

Through the praying of the Holy Office, the Church praises God without ceasing. It is the prayer that Christ addresses to the Father to honor Him and to intercede for the salvation of mankind.

Bishop Paprocki hands each Postulant the Breviary.

Bishop Paprocki:

You received the name <u>Kristen</u> on the day of your Baptism. Becoming a member of this Community you receive the name <u>Sister Mary Emmanuel</u>.

Sister Mary Emmanuel: Thanks be to God.

Bishop Paprocki:

You received the name <u>Taylor</u> on the day of your Baptism. Becoming a member of this Community you receive the name <u>Sister Mary Grace</u>.

Sister Mary Grace: Thanks be to God.

Bishop Paprocki:

You received the name <u>Bridget</u> on the day of your Baptism. Becoming a member of this Community you receive the name <u>Sister Mary Solanus</u>.

Sister Mary Solanus: Thanks be to God.

Please kneel.

Bishop Paprocki prays:

Almighty God, give Your grace to these Sisters who now wear the religious habit as a sign of their dedication. Grant that, led by the Holy Spirit, in unselfish love, humbly and perseveringly, they may fulfill their vocations. You called them to participate in a special way to build the Mystical Body of Christ. May they make Christ visible every day of their lives for the honor of the Blessed Trinity.



Penitential Rite


Bishop Paprocki: Brothers and sisters, let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.

Bishop Paprocki questions the Novices:

My dear daughters, what do you ask of God and of His Church?

The Novices respond:

We ask for God's merciful love, / and a share in the life of this religious community / of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George.

Bishop Paprocki and the Religious Community reply:

Thanks be to God.

The Novices turn to the Community.

Novices speak to the Religious Community:

By the favor of God / we have studied your Rule / and have lived among you as your Sisters for the time of probation. / We now humbly ask you / that we may dedicate ourselves to God and to His Kingdom, / and make our Profession in the religious Congregation / of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George.

Religious Community answers:

Thanks be to God.

The Novices return to their seats.

Those to profess their perpetual profession proceed to the sanctuary. They stand, facing the Bishop and Provincial Superior.

REQUEST

Bishop Paprocki questions the Junior Professed Sisters:

My dear daughters, what do you ask of God and of His Church?

The Junior Professed Sisters respond:

By the favor of God / we have come to know the life of religious dedication in this Community. / We now humbly ask / that we may make Perpetual Profession in this religious Congregation / of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George, / for the praise of God and the service of the Church.

Bishop Paprocki and the Religious Community reply:

Thanks be to God.

Bishop Paprocki speaks to the Junior Professed Sisters:

In holy Baptism the Holy Spirit has poured out His love into your hearts. This love urges you to live more and more for Christ and His Church. You fulfill this by living a life according to the evangelical counsels, in which you give yourself entirely to God.

The Sisters return to their pews.

Rite of Temporary Profession

EXAMINATION

After the homily, Bishop Paprocki questions the candidates regarding their readiness to dedicate themselves to God and to seek perfect charity according to the Rule and Constitutions of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George.

Please remain seated. The Provincial Superior and Novices stand in front of the sanctuary.

Bishop Paprocki:

My dear daughters, you are already consecrated to God by water and the Holy Spirit. Are you resolved to be more closely united to God by the new bond of religious profession?

Novices: I am.

Bishop Paprocki:

In your desire to follow Christ perfectly, are you resolved to live in celibacy as a sign of the Kingdom of heaven, to practice voluntary poverty, and to offer the sacrifice of obedience?

Novices: I am.

Bishop Paprocki:

May Almighty God give you His grace to fulfill your resolutions.

All: Amen.

PRAYER FOR GOD'S GRACE

Bishop Paprocki prays:

Let us pray: (all pray in silence)

Lord, look upon these servants of yours who wish to imitate Your Son more closely by professing the evangelical counsels in the presence of Your Church today. In love grant that their way of life may bring glory to Your Name and salvation to all mankind. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

PROFESSION

The Sisters one by one kneel before Bishop Paprocki and Mother M. Mediatrix offering their public profession.

Each Novice pronounces her vows:

With a firm resolve to consecrate myself to God, and to follow Christ unconditionally, I, Sister ______, vow to the Triune God, in the presence of this assembled community, into your hands, Mother Mary Mediatrix, until the 16th of April of next year, a life of Consecrated Chastity, in Poverty and Obedience, according to the Rule and Life of the Brothers and Sisters of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis and according to the Constitutions of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George.

With confidence in God, and trusting in the intercession of Mary, the Mother of God, and of our Holy Father Francis, I place myself at the disposal of this religious Congregation, to glorify God and to make His merciful love visible.

BESTOWAL OF THE INSIGNIA OF RELIGIOUS PROFESSION

After the profession, Bishop Paprocki, with the assistance of the Provincial Superior and the Novice Directress, present the newly professed with the veil.

Bishop Paprocki hands the black veil to each Sister saying:

Receive this veil as a sign of that wondrous marriage between the Church and Christ, her only Spouse, which should be made visible in your life.

Each Sister responds:

Christ has called me to this. "I can do all things in Him Who strengthens me" (*Philippians 4:13*).

While the Sisters leave to change into their new veils, the congregation sings the Royal Wedding Psalm 45.

Insignia Antiphon: Song of Songs 3:1, Psalm 45(44), Brown





The Sisters return in their new veils.

Bishop Paprocki says once:

Wear this crucifix and walk with the Church like a pilgrim in a foreign land, pressing forward amid the persecutions of this world and the consolations of God. Christ has redeemed us through His poverty and Passion. As members of the Church, you are called to follow His way. Strengthened by the Risen Lord, announce the Cross and Death of the Lord until He comes.

(Lumen Gentium 1, 8)

New Professed Sisters: Amen.

Bishop Paprocki hands the crucifixes to the Sisters.

Bishop Paprocki says once:

Receive the Rosary of the Seven Joys of the Blessed Mother. Mary is the Prototype of the Church. She advanced in her pilgrimage of faith. Therefore, look upon her in your apostolic work. She, in her life, lived an example of maternal love. You should be animated by this love when you collaborate in the apostolic mission of the Church on behalf of the rebirth of men.

New Professed Sisters: Amen.

Bishop Paprocki hands the Franciscan Crown Rosaries to the Sisters.

The Sisters return to their pews.



Rite of Perpetual Profession

Those to make their perpetual profession stand and approach the sanctuary.

EXAMINATION

Bishop Paprocki questions the Sisters on their readiness to dedicate themselves perpetually to God and to seek perfect charity according to the Rule and Constitutions of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George.

Bishop Paprocki:

My dear daughters, through Baptism you are already dead to sin and consecrated to the Lord. Are you resolved to unite yourselves more closely to Him by the bond of Perpetual Profession?

Temporary Professed Sisters:

I am, for I believe I can do all things in Him Who strengthens me.

Bishop Paprocki:

God has loved you with an everlasting love and has drawn you to Himself in His great mercy. Today you have come to the altar to take forever the vows of celibacy for the sake of the Kingdom of God, poverty, and obedience. Consider once more the obligation you freely take upon yourselves. If you want to commit your lives totally to God, you must follow Christ wherever He leads you.

I ask you, therefore, in the presence of the people of God: Will you forever forego the joys of marriage and unite yourselves more closely to Christ by the bond of perpetual profession to make visible the love of the Church for Christ?

Temporary Professed Sisters: Yes, I will.

Bishop Paprocki:

Will you, throughout your entire lives, continue in poverty Christ's life of self-denial in the service of others?

Temporary Professed Sisters: Yes, I will.

Bishop Paprocki:

Are you willing through your obedience in this Community, at the call of the Church, to build up the Kingdom of God?

Temporary Professed Sisters:

Yes, I am willing and ask again to make Perpetual Profession in this Community.

Bishop Paprocki:

May He Who began this good work in you see to its completion before the day of Christ Jesus.

All: Amen.



LITANY

As a congregation, we ask that the Saints offer their strength and support, interceding to God on the Sisters' behalf.



Each Temporary Professed Sister pronounces her vows:

With a firm resolve to consecrate myself to God, and to follow Christ unconditionally, I, Sister ______, vow to the Triune God, in the presence of this assembled community, into your hands, Mother Mary Mediatrix, forever, a life of Consecrated Chastity, in Poverty and Obedience, according to the Rule and Life of the Brothers and Sisters of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis and according to the Constitutions of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Francis of the Martyr St. George.

With confidence in God, and trusting in the intercession of Mary, the Mother of God, and of our Holy Father Francis, I place myself at the disposal of this religious Congregation, to glorify God and to make His merciful love visible.

After her perpetual profession, each Sister goes to the altar to place her written profession on it; she then signs the document of profession on the altar.

The signed profession remains on the altar, representing the Sister's consecration of her life; her sacrifice and personal offering are joined to the sacrifice of the Mass and offered up to God with it.

Please remain standing.

When they have all made their perpetual profession, the Sisters stand before the altar and sing "Take, Lord, Receive" with the choir, expressing their spirit of self-giving and joy:

Take, Lord, Receive

Take, Lord, receive, all my liberty, my memory, understanding, my entire will.

Refrain:

Give me only Your love and Your grace; That's enough for me. Your love and Your grace are enough for me.

Take, Lord, receive, all I have and possess. You have given all to me; now I return it. **Refrain**

Take, Lord, receive, all is Yours now:
Dispose of it wholly according to Your Will.

SOLEMN CONSECRATION OF THE PROFESSED

Holy Mother Church confirms, by a liturgical consecration, the religious profession. She implores the heavenly Father to pour forth in abundance upon the professed the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Bishop Paprocki, with hands extended over them, says the prayer of blessing:

Father in heaven, our desire to serve You is itself Your gift and our perseverance needs Your guiding hand. How right it is that we should sing Your praise.

With boundless love You created the human family through Your Word, in the Holy Spirit, and lifted it up into communion with Yourself; You make the human family Your bride radiant with Your own likeness, adorned with the gift of everlasting life.

When Your bride, deceived by the evil one, broke faith with You, You did not abandon her. With everlasting love You renewed with Your servant Noah the covenant You made with Adam.

Then You chose Abraham, the man of faith, to be the father of a people more numerous than the stars of heaven.

By the hand of Moses You sealed a covenant

with them in the tables of the law.

Throughout the ages there arose from this favored people holy women renowned for devotion and courage, justice and faith.

In the fullness of time You raised up the Holy Virgin from the stock of Jesse. The Holy Spirit was to come upon her, and Your power was to overshadow her, making her the Immaculate Mother of the world's Redeemer.

He became poor, humble, and obedient, the source and pattern of all holiness. He formed the Church into His bride, loving it with love so great that He gave Himself up for it and sanctified it in His blood.

Father, in Your loving wisdom
You have singled out many of Your daughters
to be disciples espoused to Christ
and to receive the honor of His love.
Holy Church shines with their rich variety,
a bride adorned with jewels, a queen robed in grace,
a mother rejoicing in her children.
Father, we earnestly pray You: send the fire of the
Holy Spirit into the hearts of Your daughters
to keep alive within them the holy desire
He has given them.

Lord, may the glory of Baptism and holiness of life shine in their hearts.

Strengthened by the vows of their consecration, may they be always one with You in loving fidelity to Christ, their only Bridegroom.

May they cherish the Church as their mother and love the whole world as God's creation, teaching all people to look forward in joy and hope to the good things of heaven.

Lord, holy Father, guide the steps of Your servants and guard them on their pilgrimage through life. When they come at last to the throne of Christ the King, may they not fear Him as their judge, but hear the voice of their Bridegroom lovingly inviting them to the wedding feast of heaven. We ask this through Christ our Lord.



BESTOWAL OF THE INSIGNIA OF PERPETUAL PROFESSION

The ring externally signifies the perpetual dedication to God that the Sisters have made.

The choir and congregation together sing the insignia antiphon as the Sister approaches Bishop Paprocki. In between each Sister's bestowal, the Royal Wedding Psalm 45 is sung by the cantors, followed by the antiphon again at the end.





Guidelines for Receiving Communion

For Catholics

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

For our fellow Christians

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (canon 844 §4). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of Communion by Christians of these Churches (canon 844 §3).


For those not receiving Holy Communion

For non-Christians

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.

Apostolic Blessing for the Jubilee Year

The Holy See has authorized the Most Reverend Thomas John Paprocki, Bishop of Springfield in Illinois, to impart the Papal Blessing at the conclusion of the Holy Mass offered on the occasion of this Jubilee Year for those in attendance or watching via livestream.

The Apostolic Blessing carries with it a plenary (or full) indulgence, as long as the recipient makes a sacramental confession of sins, receives the Eucharist, and prays for the intentions of the Pope (praying a Hail Mary and Our Father for the Holy Father's intentions is suggested), and is free of attachment to sin. These acts "may be carried out several days preceding or following the performance of the prescribed works. But, it is more fitting that Communion and the prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the day the work is performed". (Handbook of Indulgences, Norms for Indulgences, 23.3)

Deacon:

The Most Reverend Father Thomas John, by the grace of God and the Apostolic See, Bishop of this holy Church of Springfield in Illinois, will give the (apostolic) blessing with a plenary indulgence, in the name of the Roman Pontiff, to all present who are truly penitent and have confessed their sins and received Holy Communion

Pray to God for our Most Holy Father, Pope Francis, our Bishop Thomas John, and for holy Mother Church and strive, by holiness of life, to walk in full communion with it.

Bishop Paprocki: The Lord be with you.

All: And with your spirit.

Bishop Paprocki:

May God bless you with every heavenly blessing, make you always holy and pure in his sight, pour out in abundance upon you the riches of his glory, and teach you with the words of truth;

may he instruct you in the Gospel of salvation, and ever endow you with fraternal charity. Through Christ our Lord.

Blessing of the Crucifixes

DECREE

The Apostolic Penitentiary, by the power granted in a special manner by Our Most Holy Father in Christ, Pope Francis, through Divine Providence, kindly grants to the Most Excellent and Reverend Father, Thomas John Paprocki, Bishop of Springfield in Illinois, that, on the occasion of the hundredth anniversary of the American Province of the Congregation of the Franciscan Sisters of St. George the Martyr, on a day chosen for the benefit of the faithful, after the celebration of the Divine Sacrifice, he may impart to all the faithful present, who are truly penitent and driven by charity, and who have participated in the same sacred rites, the **Papal Blessing** with the attached *plenary* indulgence, to be gained under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff).

The faithful who devoutly receive the **Papal Blessing**, even if, for a reasonable cause, they are not physically present at the sacred rites, provided that they follow the rites devoutly through television or radio broadcast, will be able to obtain the *plenary* indulgence, in accordance with the norm of the law.
